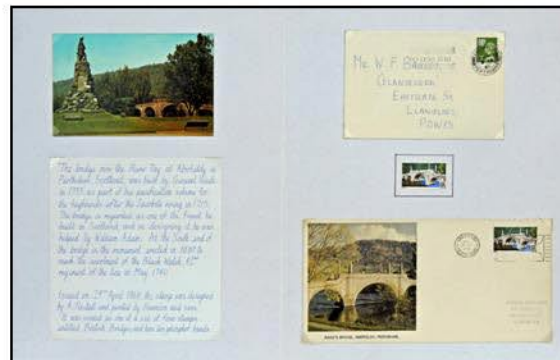


Aberfeldy bridge



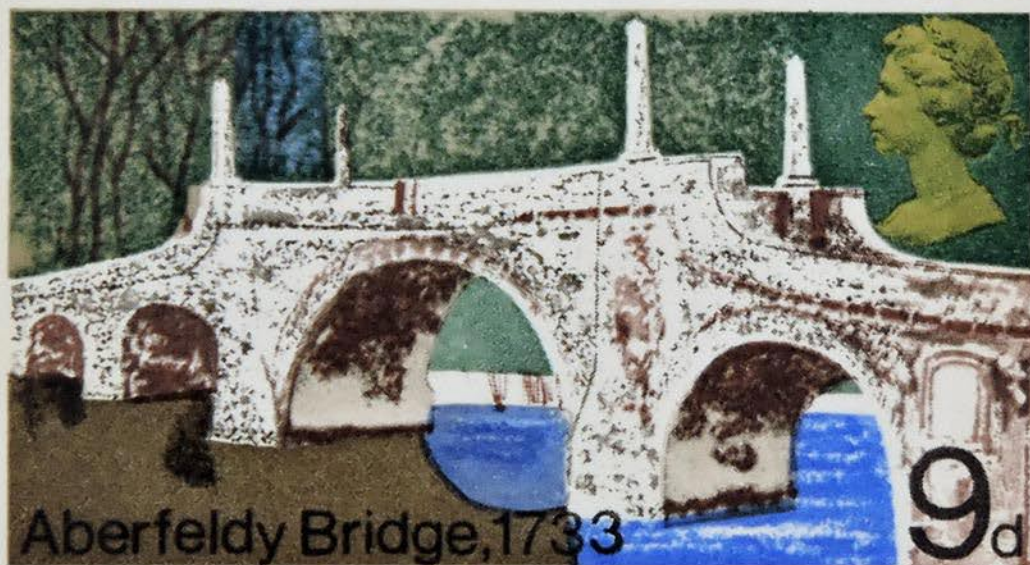
The bridge over the River Tay at Aberfeldy in Perthshire, Scotland, was built by General Wade in 1733 as part of his pacification scheme for the highlands after the Jacobite rising in 1715. The bridge is regarded as one of the finest he built in Scotland, and in designing it, he was helped by William Adam. At the South end of the bridge is the monument erected in 1887 to mark the enrolment of the Black Watch, 42nd regiment of the line in May 1740.

Issued on 29th April 1968, the stamp was designed by A. Restall and printed by Harrison and sons. It was issued as one of a set of four stamps entitled British Bridges, and has two phosphor bands.

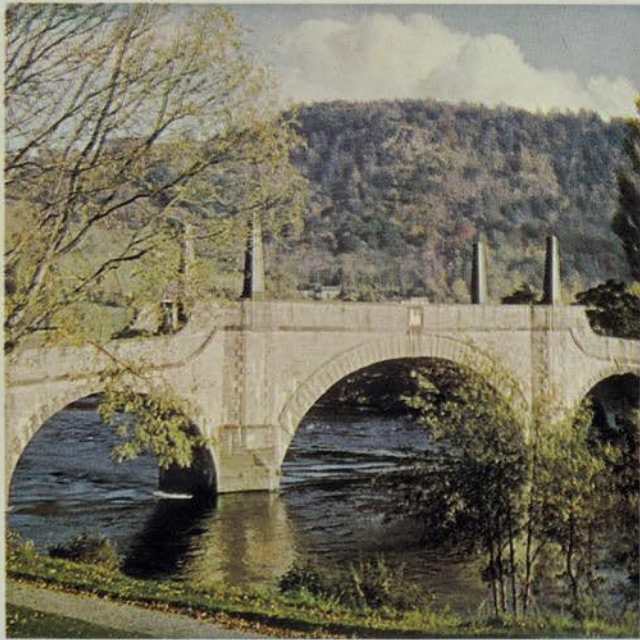
